***Here is your PERMANENT Medicaid Identification Card!***

**Remove the ID cards and keep this card holder as it has important information for you to remember.**

**Carry the Medicaid ID card with you at all times and present it when any member of the household goes to a medical appointment. The health care provider will use this card to find out if you are eligible for Medicaid. If you are enrolled with a managed care organization, and they gave you a separate card, it is also important that you take that ID card with you as well.**

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

- ✓ **Keep this information and all mail that you receive about your eligibility for Medicaid.**
- ✓ **You should make sure your provider has all of your private insurance and Medicaid information.**
- ✓ **If you receive a bill from the health care provider (hospital, doctor, pharmacy, etc.) for services received by you or a member of your household while eligible for Medicaid, you should contact that provider immediately to see if they have billed Medicaid. DO NOT ASSUME THAT THE PROVIDER HAS BILLED MEDICAID. If you have questions regarding this, please contact your caseworker. If the service provided is a Medicaid covered service that you are eligible for, you should not have to pay the medical bill.**
- ✓ **Do not let anyone else use your card. It is against the law.**
- ✓ **Keep this card even if you get a notice saying that you are no longer eligible for Medicaid. If you are eligible for Medicaid in the future, you will use the same ID card.**

**To report a lost or stolen card, call your caseworker to request another card.**
