1. What type of work boots are you looking for? Steel toe? Composite toe? 6"?	Please refer to the specifications found in the Invitation to Bid Document. Section 1.B. Plain toe and Section 1.A. Minimum 6" Leather Upper.
2. Some of these quantities are large. Should we quote a lead time?	Quantities reflect annual usage. Yes, please quote a lead time per Section 4.A. & B. of the specifications.

<p>3. The State of Nebraska is purchasing boots from our company now. With widths A – EEEEE. This boot is a full grain leather boot. It is purchased because it is long wearing. You have listed “core” boots that are “Split Grain” leather boots which are not as durable. Does the State going after two different quality boots, or are you looking for just one style boot?</p>	<p>Under Section 1 – SPECIFICATIONS: INMATE WORK BOOTS, PRICING PER PAIR.</p> <p>The following line is hereby added:</p> <p>S. Split Grain boots or equivalent</p> <p>Any other boot would be considered part of the non-core inmate work boots. Bidder may identify product bidding on Attachment A – Non Core Items Inmate Work Boots under the Other Categories section.</p>
<p>4. You specify that the commercial trucking companies (where cases of boots are shipped on skids) will be unloaded by the truck driver and moved to a designated areas in the facility. Most companies will use commercial delivery companies (LTL; UPS; FedEx).). Inside delivery charges levied by the trucking companies increase the bid prices that we must bid. Making it more expensive for Nebraska DOC. DO all DOC location have loading docks? Commercial delivery drivers will not stay extended time for your personal to check in and process the orders.</p>	<p>Not all locations have a delivery dock, but facilities have a delivery area. Orders will be signed for by staff at the point of delivery.</p>
