<p>3. Section 4 Centrifugal Force A. Minimum total for both drums of 21,500 pounds. Question would 16,142 pounds be acceptable? Comment I looked at all rollers in this class and none meet the 21,500 pounds that I could find.</p>	<p>Please comply with specifications as written.</p>

Question, Are these prices to be comparable models that are 240 months old that are “currently for sale” or “recent auction results sold units”</p>	<p>Please use “recent auction results sold units”</p>
<p>6. Question, After the salvage price is established should 240 months of inflation be added to the price to reflect the salvage price 240 months from the date of the bid?</p>	<p>No</p>
<p>7. Question, If inflation is allowed should the US governmental CPI calculator index be used or some other source?</p>	<p>See answer to Question #6</p>
<p>8. Question, Is Machinery Trader or Richey Bros Auctions an approved source.</p>	<p>Either is acceptable.</p>
