<p>Set up Internet Explorer 7.0 on your computer to work with NIS.</p>	<p> Before making any changes to your work computer check with your local IT individuals.</p> <p>Steps</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Open Internet Explorer. 2. Click on Tools on the right hand side of the screen, and select Internet Options. 3. Select the Advanced tab and scroll down to HTTP 1.1 settings. 4. Make sure the “Use HTTP 1.1 though proxy connections” box is checked. 5. Scroll down to Security and make sure the “Use SSL 2.0” box is checked. 6. Select the Privacy tab, and then click on the Sites button. 7. Type ne.gov in the Address of website field and click on Allow. Then click OK. 8. Select the Privacy tab, and make sure the Turn on Pop-up Blocker box is not checked. Click Apply. 9. Select the Security tab and make sure the Internet zone is selected. Click on the Custom level button. 10. Scroll to Downloads, and select Enable button for Automatic prompting for file downloads and for File download. 11. Scroll down to Miscellaneous, and click on the Enable button for Allow script-initiated windows without size or position constraint. 12. Scroll to Scripting, and select Enable on Active scripting and for Scripting of Java applets. Then click OK. 13. Select the General tab, and click on the Settings button under Browsing history. 14. Select Automatically under the Check for newer versions of stored pages, and click OK. 15. Click on OK to close the Internet Options window. <p> Various updates to your PC, such as upgrading from Internet Explorer 6.0 to Internet Explorer 7.0, auto updates, or reimaging of your PC can change your Internet Explorer settings and consequently cause problems again viewing PDFs through NIS. If you have changed your settings in the past, and are experiencing problems again, be sure to check them again.</p> <p> Either the Java 2 JDK or the Microsoft Java JDK must be running your computer. This is something that should be set up already on your computer, but if you are not sure, or have questions please check with your local IT individuals.</p> <p> Internet Explorer 6.0 is packaged with Windows XP Professional, and SP1 must be applied.
