These documents shall be subject to negotiation and will be incorporated as addendums if agreed to by the Parties.

If a conflict or ambiguity arises after the Addendum to Contract Award have been negotiated and agreed to, the Addendum to Contract Award shall be interpreted as follows:

- 1. If only one Party has a particular clause, then that clause shall control;
- 2. If both Parties have a similar clause, but the clauses do not conflict, the clauses shall be read together;
- 3. If both Parties have a similar clause, but the clauses conflict, the State's clause shall control.

D. GOVERNING LAW (Statutory)

Notwithstanding any other provision of this contract, or any amendment or addendum(s) entered into contemporaneously or at a later time, the parties understand and agree that, (1) the State of Nebraska is a sovereign state and its authority to contract is therefore subject to limitation by the State's Constitution, statutes, common law, and regulation; (2) this contract will be interpreted and enforced under the laws of the State of Nebraska; (3) any action to enforce the provisions of this agreement must be brought in the State of Nebraska per state law; (4) the person signing this contract on behalf of the State of Nebraska does not have the authority to waive the State's sovereign immunity, statutes, common law, or regulations; (5) the indemnity, limitation of liability, remedy, and other similar provisions of the final contract, if any, are entered into subject to the State's Constitution, statutes, common law, regulations, and sovereign immunity; and, (6) all terms and conditions of the final contract, including but not limited to the clauses concerning third party use, licenses, warranties, limitations of liability, governing law and venue, usage verification, indemnity, liability, remedy or other similar provisions of the final contract are entered into specifically subject to the State's Constitution, statutes, common law, regulations, and sovereign immunity.

The Parties must comply with all applicable local, state, and federal laws, ordinances, rules, orders, and regulations.

E. BEGINNING OF WORK

The contractor shall not commence any billable work until a valid contract has been fully executed by the State and the successful Contractor. The Contractor will be notified in writing when work may begin.

If a judgment or settlement is obtained or reasonably anticipated against the State's use of any intellectual property for which the Contractor has indemnified the State, the Contractor shall, at the Contractor's sole cost and expense, promptly modify the item or items which were determined to be infringing, acquire a license or licenses on the State's behalf to provide the necessary rights to the State to eliminate the infringement, or provide the State with a non-infringing substitute that provides the State the same functionality. The Contractor shall secure, at its own expense, all personnel required to perform the services under the contract. All personnel assigned by the Contractor to the contract shall be employees of the Contractor or a subcontractor, and shall be fully qualified to perform the work required herein. Personnel employed by the Contractor or a subcontractor to fulfill the terms of the contract shall remain under the sole direction and control of the Contractor or the subcontractor respectively.

With respect to its employees, the Contractor agrees to be solely responsible for the following:

- 1. Any and all pay, benefits, and employment taxes and/or other payroll withholding;
- 2. Any and all vehicles used by the Contractor's employees, including all insurance required by state law:
- 3. Damages incurred by Contractor's employees within the scope of their duties under the contract;
- 4. Maintaining Workers' Compensation and health insurance that complies with state and federal law and submitting any reports on such insurance to the extent required by governing law;
- 5. Determining the hours to be worked and the duties to be performed by the Contractor's employees; and,
- 6. All claims on behalf of any person arising out of employment or alleged employment (including without limit claims of discrimination alleged against the Contractor, its officers, agents, or subcontractors or subcontractor's employees)

The Contractor shall comply with all applicable local, state, and federal statutes and regulations regarding civil rights laws and equal opportunity employment. The Nebraska Fair Employment Practice Act prohibits Contractors of the State of Nebraska, and their Subcontractors, from discriminating against any employee or applicant for employment, with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, compensation, or privileges of employment because of race, color, religion, sex, disability, marital status, or national origin (Neb. A. PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Nebraska Board of Parole / Division of Parole Supervision is seeking Contractors to provide transitional housing including mental health programming, for parole clients. The objective of this project is to provide transitional housing and housing support services to adult parole clients in a monitored environment that allows parole clients to live independently. The target population for this housing opportunity is offenders released from the Nebraska Department of Correctional Services under the supervision of the Nebraska Board of Parole / Division of Parole Supervision who do not have an acceptable home/family placement.

This transitional living is intended to be temporary transitional housing until the parole client obtains employment or other stable income and appropriate housing. Although there is no minimum length of stay, the typical length of stay ranges from six (6) to eight (8) weeks. It is estimated that some parole clients may reside in the transitional housing for up to six (6) months prior to establishing other permanent housing. These figures are estimates and in no way are a guarantee of a specific length of stay.

NBOP is targeting certain metropolitan areas of the state to provide housing based on the number of homeless parole clients returning to various communities over the past fiscal year, which are able to provide some level of mental health programming. Mental health programming is not required, but it will be a factor considered when awarding contracts.

B. PROJECT ENVIRONMENT

Contractors who provide mental health programming must have licensed mental health professionals on staff. Contractors must also meet the required local zoning ordinances and requirements applicable to the physical address of the transitional living facility or have obtained special use permits applicable to their geographic areas. - 2. If both Parties have a similar clause, but the clauses do not conflict, the clauses shall be read together;
- 3. If both Parties have a similar clause, but the clauses conflict, the State's clause shall control.

The Nebraska Board of Parole / Division of Parole Supervision is seeking Contractors to provide transitional housing including mental health programming, for parole clients. The objective of this project is to provide transitional housing and housing support services to adult parole clients in a monitored environment that allows parole clients to live independently. The target population for this housing opportunity is offenders released from the Nebraska Department of Correctional Services under the supervision of the Nebraska Board of Parole / Division of Parole Supervision who do not have an acceptable home/family placement.

This transitional living is intended to be temporary transitional housing until the parole client obtains employment or other stable income and appropriate housing. Although there is no minimum length of stay, the typical length of stay ranges from six (6) to eight (8) weeks. It is estimated that some parole clients may reside in the transitional housing for up to six (6) months prior to establishing other permanent housing. These figures are estimates and in no way are a guarantee of a specific length of stay.

NBOP is targeting certain metropolitan areas of the state to provide housing based on the number of homeless parole clients returning to various communities over the past fiscal year, which are able to provide some level of mental health programming. Mental health programming is not required, but it will be a factor considered when awarding contracts.

B. PROJECT ENVIRONMENT

Contractors who provide mental health programming must have licensed mental health professionals on staff. 

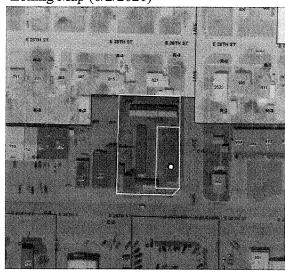



Corporate Overview

Heather Santiago LLC dba Kearney's Village is located at 824 East 25th Street Kearney Nebraska. The company name and location has remained the same since the origination of the company in July 2019.

Kearney's Village is a transitional and sober living facility that houses up to 54 adult men and women. Kearney's Village is a support for men and women struggling with addiction, mental illness, homelessness, and criminal activity. Our program is designed to assist individuals from all walks of life with housing, self-sufficiency, and sobriety. We provide programming and housing to individuals to help each individual with their personal struggles and goals. We have worked hand in hand with many agencies. We have provided housing and programming to clients being supervised by Parole, Post Release Supervision, Probation, and Drug Court. At this time Kearney's Village does not have a licensed Mental Health Professional at our location. However, we work hand in hand with outside agencies such as Region 3, Richard Young, and South Central Behavioral Services to meet the needs of our clients struggling with mental health needs.

Corporate Experience:

Since opening Kearney's Village in July of 2019 we have maintained a professional relationship with state agencies such as Parole, Probation, Drug Court, and Post Release. Kearney's Village is registered as "Transitional Living With Programming" with Probation, Drug Court, and Post Release. In addition to these agencies we are also a resource for the local hospitals, mental health facilities, homeless shelter, and treatment facilities. Our Program Plan is a written description of the services we offer, what can be expected of Kearney's Village, our program,

and other information regarding the programming that we provide.

There is not a relationship currently or previously regarding any individual name in this proposal being an employee of the State.

During the past 5 years, (Since date of organization) Kearney's Village has not had any contracts terminated.

Personnel/Management Approach:

Kearney's Village is made up of a team of individuals that are hired and trained to assist the clients that come into our program. These employees are required to pass drug and alcohol testing, not be on the Sex Offender Registry, not have any convictions for law violations within the last 6 months, and not be on any form of Supervision such as Parole, Probation, etc. Employees are hired with a strict code of conduct that is a requirement for them to follow as part of their employment.

Heather Santiago is the Owner/Director of Kearney's VIllage who works side by side all staff and Residents. Heather works a minimum of 8 hours per day. She assists Residents with goals and budgeting. She teaches the budgeting classes and meets with all Residents for a one on one meeting to go over their goals and progress. Heather is the primary person that helps Residents in creating their "game plan" while at Kearney's Village. Heather is responsible for creating rules for employees and residents.

RoseAna Salinas, Lisa Rodriguez, Michael Robinson, Damian Harper, Sean Hampton, Esmeralda Salinas, Ian Smith and Elijah Harper are all employees that assist with every day business at Kearney's Village. They assist with drug testing, intake of new Residents, supervision of Residents, and assisting with Resident needs. These individuals also assist with Life Skills Classes, room checks, verification of Resident employment, assisting with employment applications etc. All employees use our Shift Notes to document any activity during their shift and in addition they document each Resident file with any information that is needed such as medication changes, employment changes, write ups, etc. All of this information is also forwarded to any Supervising Officers. All employees report to Heather Santiago.



Cost Proposal

The proposed cost of \$90 per day for Parole Clients covers all parts of their programming and living while on a "voucher paid status" through NBOP. All Residents receive the same programming and support.

This cost covers housing, utilities, internet, life skills, budgeting, weekly goals and progress, drug/alcohol testing and 24 on site support from staff. This cost also covers weekly reports regarding the resident to Parole. In addition, provides a private office specifically for the use of Supervising Officers to use to meet with their clients.

When a client arrives at Kearney's Village this cost also covers vouchers from Kearney's Village for clothing and hygiene items from our Thrift Store. In addition, if the resident doesn't have the means to purchase food - Kearney's Village also assists with that.

Many times a resident will come to Kearney's Village without any form of identification.

Kearney's Village immediately provides assistance with the resident obtaining a birth certificate, social security card, and state identifification card/drivers license.

In the event that a client is eligible for a drivers license and needs assistance with the driving portion - Kearney's Village will provide the "street legal vehicle" to do so.

During the "voucher period" the Resident/NBOP is not responsible for any additional fees above the agreed cost.

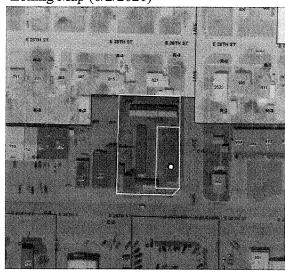
