While our goal is to provide reports as quickly as possible, our pathologists need time to obtain all pertinent records and perform a thorough analysis prior to signing out a case. is inspected and governed by CAP (College of American Pathologists). Their requirements state the following:	4. The Contractor shall provide any drug-related autopsy results to the County Coroner according to the schedule governed by the College of American Pathologists (CAP). "ANP.33120 - The final autopsy report is produced within 60 working days in 90% of the cases. Note: The 90% threshold is used in recognition of the fact that occasional unusual cases may require more than 60 days for completion, particularly when external consultation is required."
