1.		Assume since NDOT is the end user, the machine will be used outdoors in a road/street cleaning capacity.	Yes, the sweeper is for outdoor road/street cleaning.
2.		Because no hopper is requested, further assume debris collection is not intended.	That is correct, no debris collection.
3.		Assume that perhaps this machine also could be described as a "scrubber."	The machine is a sweeper; I would not describe it as a scrubber.
4.		Please confirm our assumptions are correct or, otherwise, what the intended usage is.	Assumptions have been confirmed for lines one (1) through four (4). Per Section VI, Y, 2 "Estimated Annual Usage: Four (4) EA"
5.	Page 2, line 5 Deduct for rops in lieu of cab.	OSHA Regulation 29 CFR 1926.1153 Silicon dust. https://www.osha.gov/laws-regs/regulations/standardnumber/1926/1926.1153 They can build OROPS machine but have never delivered any in the state because of this Regulation. The OROP machine go overseas. Would the State consider buying a OROPS machine?	The State has never purchased a sweeper with a ROPS.
