1.			"Does Nebraska PERS have Regression Test cases developed for current functionality of NPRIS? If yes are these regression test cases automated with help from any automated testing tools?"	No. NPERS does not have any regression test cases developed. NPERS also does not have any automated testing tool or automated tests setup. The State requires regression testing to be conducted and documented as part of the test plan to be submitted by the bidder. The Contractor is responsible for the creation and completion of the regression test scripts and testing.
2.	L	24	Please describe your approach, policies, and any restrictions to services performed (development, project administration, conversion, testing, etc.) or data temporarily located offshore?	The State requires the Contractor to state the location from which the consultant will be working. At all times, NPERS data will be located on the NPERS network and databases. The State requires the data migration team to be based in and work within the USA. Resources located outside the USA will not be granted

				access to Production data. Currently there are no other restrictions/policies related to services being performed from outside the USA.
3.	3.e.	39	What is Contractor's responsibility for data clean up, remediation, and correction of records found to be Not In Good Order? Are there existing external vendors that Contractor should coordinate data clean up and conversion with?	The State will be responsible for manual data cleansing. Currently, there are no external Contractors with whom the contractor will need to coordinate. However, the mapping/conversion of the data must be coordinated with the NPERS and OSERS teams.
4.	3.i.	46	What level of Post Implementation Stabilization Support "as appropriate" is anticipated from Contractor?	The State requires the Contractor to correct all defects in the code altered or created for the OSERS project during the 12-month post-implementation period.
