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#### 1. Introduction

Ashton-Potter (USA) Ltd. ("Ashton Potter") is pleased to have the opportunity to respond to the Invitation To Bid ("ITB") #6789 OF for Cigarette Tax Stamps ("Tax Stamps") for the State of Nebraska Department of Revenue ("State" and/or "Agency").

Ashton Potter acknowledges Addendums #1, #2 and #3 that were issued for this solicitation.

Ashton Potter was formed in the 1920's and over the past 50 years has become one of the world's largest high-quality secure stamp and label manufacturers and produces a wide range of security printing products and support services. Ashton Potter's core specializations include:

- High security printing solutions for:
  - o Excise, fiscal, revenue and tax stamps for governments worldwide
    - Fusion (also known as heat applied) and pressure-sensitive ("PSA") formats
  - Secure vital record documents
  - o Postage stamps and related products for postal Administrative Services
  - Security printed products for government and industry
  - ProLinc®, an advanced SaaS-based software solution for track and trace and MES applications

Since 1991, Ashton Potter has been a key supplier for the United States Postal Service's ("USPS") Stamp Program. We are committed to working with government agencies to provide the best quality product and superior customer support. Since entering the market, Ashton Potter has distinctively become the fastest growing supplier of heat applied tax stamps in the United States.

Ashton Potter is fully committed to this market, unlike some previous suppliers who ceased supply after a few years.

Ashton Potter firmly believes that once a stamp is transferred from the carrier paper to a package of cigarettes that's where it should securely stay to be validated in the field by trained inspectors. To this end our stamps have been designed with an aggressive adhesive to do just that; keep the Tax Stamp adhering to the cigarette package and not flaking off in the field after application.

Ashton Potter's strength lies in the ability to cost effectively manage large, single-award, multi-year, multi-product contracts and programs for a range of customers worldwide. Encompassing a commitment to investment and considerable printing and finishing capacity, has enabled production levels to continually grow, customer base to broaden and product offerings to develop and expand into adjacent high security markets.

Ashton Potter has considerable printing experience and capabilities related to the manufacturing of security products and its high security manufacturing facilities offers a broad range of print methods including web offset, intaglio, flexography, gravure, rotary screen and digital in roll/coil, sheet and booklet formats. In addition, Ashton Potter offers its customers state-of-the-art digital prepress, inhouse platemaking, a wide range of finishing technologies, secure technology manufacturing, automated processes, 100% electronic inspection, modern security and accountability systems and secure material destruction.

#### II. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

If the State and Bidder fail to agree on the final Terms and Conditions, the State reserves the right to reject the bid. The State is soliciting bids in response to the solicitation. The State reserves the right to reject bids that attempt to substitute the Bidder's commercial contracts and/or documents for this solicitation.

The Bidder should submit with their bid any license, user agreement, service level agreement, or similar documents that the Bidder wants incorporated in the Contract. Upon notice of Intent to Award, the Bidder must submit a copy of these documents in an editable Word format. The State will not consider incorporation of any document not submitted with the Bidder's bid. These documents shall be subject to negotiation and will be incorporated as addendums if agreed to by the Parties.

If a conflict or ambiguity arises after the addendums have been negotiated and agreed to, the addendums shall be interpreted as follows:

- 1. If only one (1) Party's document has a particular clause, then that clause shall control;
- 2. If both Party's documents have a similar clause, but the clauses do not conflict, the clauses shall be read together.
- 3. If both Party's documents have a similar clause, but the clauses conflict, the State's clause shall control.

The PCO's Representative has no authority to bind the State to a contract, amendment, addendum, or other change or addition to the contract.

#### D. GOVERNING LAW (Statutory)

Notwithstanding any other provision of this contract, or any amendment or addendum(s) entered into contemporaneously or at a later time, the parties understand and agree that, (1) the State of Nebraska is a sovereign state and its authority to contract is therefore subject to limitation by the State's Constitution, statutes, common law, and regulation; (2) this contract will be interpreted and enforced under the laws of the State of Nebraska; (3) any action to enforce the provisions of this contract must be brought in the State of Nebraska per state law; (4) the person signing this contract on behalf of the State of Nebraska does not have the authority to waive the State's sovereign immunity, statutes, common law, or regulations; (5) the indemnity, limitation of liability, remedy, and other similar provisions of the final contract, if any, are entered into subject to the State's Constitution, statutes, common law, regulations, and sovereign immunity; and, (6) all terms and conditions of the final contract, including but not limited to the clauses concerning third-party use, licenses, warranties, limitations of liability, governing law and venue, usage verification, indemnity, liability, remedy or other similar provisions of the final contract are entered into specifically subject to the State's Constitution, statutes, common law, regulations, and sovereign immunity. The Bidder agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the State and its employees, volunteers, agents, and its elected and appointed officials ("the indemnified parties") from and against any and all claims, liens, demands, damages, liability, actions, causes of action, losses, judgments, costs, and expenses of every nature, including investigation costs and expenses, settlement costs, and attorney fees and expenses ("the claims"), sustained or asserted against the State for personal injury, death, or property loss or damage, arising out of, resulting from, or attributable to the willful misconduct, negligence, error, or omission of the Bidder, its employees, Subcontractors, consultants, representatives, and agents, resulting from this contract, except to the extent such Bidder liability is attenuated by any action of the State which directly and proximately contributed to the claims.

#### 2. SELF-INSURANCE (Statutory)

The State is self-insured for any loss and purchases excess insurance coverage pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-8,239.01 (Reissue 2008). If there is a presumed loss under the provisions of this contract, Bidder may file a claim with the Office of Risk Management pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 81-8,829 through 81-8,306 for review by the State Claims Board. The State retains all rights and immunities under the State Miscellaneous (Section 81-8,294), Tort (Section 81-8,209), and Contract Claim Acts (Section 81-8,302), as outlined in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-8,209 et seq. and under any other provisions of law and accepts liability under this contract to the extent provided by law.

The Bidder warrants that all persons assigned to the project shall be employees of the Bidder or a Subcontractor and shall be fully qualified to perform the work required herein. Personnel employed by the Bidder or a subcontractor to fulfill the terms of the contract shall remain under the sole direction and control of the Bidder or the subcontractor respectively.

With respect to its employees, the Bidder agrees to be solely responsible for the following:

- 1. Any and all pay, benefits, and employment taxes and/or other payroll withholding;
- 2. Any and all vehicles used by the Bidder's employees, including all insurance required by state law;
- 3. Damages incurred by Bidder's employees within the scope of their duties under the contract;

Overpayments and audit costs owed to the State shall be paid within ninety (90) days of written notice of the claim. The Bidder agrees to correct any material weaknesses or condition found as a result of the audit.

The State reserves the right to extend the period of this contract beyond the end date when mutually agreeable to the Bidder and the State.

All items proposed shall be of the latest manufacture in production as of the date of the solicitation and be of proven performance and under standard design complete as regularly advertised and marketed. All necessary materials for satisfactory performance of the supplies shall be incorporated into the **Cigarette Tax Stamps** whether or not they may be specifically mentioned below.

Complete specifications, manufacturer's current descriptive literature and/or advertising data sheets with cuts or photographs must be included with the bid for the IDENTICAL items proposed. Any information necessary to show compliance with these specifications not given on the manufacturer's descriptive literature and/or advertising data sheets must be supplied in writing on or attached to the bid document. If manufacturer's information necessary to show compliance with these specifications is not attached to the bid document, the Bidder may be required to submit requested information within three (3) business days of a written request. Failure to submit requested descriptive literature or advertising data sheets may be grounds to reject the bid.
