Do bidders need to provide only 3 summaries of projects of similar size and scope or does the state want more than 3 and will pick from all those provided?	Only 3 projects are required.

2) May the bidder propose alternate coverage amounts for negotiable insurance requirements?	Yes, bidder can submit an alternative insurance requirement.
3) May the bidder wholly reject the Pollution Liability coverage requirement and still be a viable contract contender?	This is negotiable

The current NHB program administrator contracts with 12 unique communities, six consultants/coaches/trainers, and a statewide program evaluator for training, technical assistance, implementation, and evaluation of the Early Childhood Pyramid Model for Supporting Social Emotional Competence. Must the bidder provide the details described in subparts e h. for ALL 12 communities and additional contractual service providers / mental health professionals working with these communities?	No, the bidder is free to provide details about the sub-contractors deemed necessary for understanding the scope of the services.
Will the state accept Letters of Support and Letters of Commitment from bidder partners?	Yes, we will.
The bidder's plan for Early Childhood Pyramid Model expansion to new communities relies on multiple and varying factors including sufficient funding, community readiness, availability of qualified mental health professionals in the geographic area, and bidder staffing capacity to manage expansion, etc. Being uncertain as to the actual term of this RFP – one or five years – is it acceptable to propose average anticipated costs for expansion without identifying specific communities and subcontractors in those communities? Should the Bidder submit via email one single pdf document containing all components of the proposal: 1. Signed Contractual Services Form, 2. Executive Summary, 3. Corporate Overview, 4. Technical Approach, 5. Yes, project is to be initially funded for one year, with the ability to renew the grant for up to 5 additional years without reading the grant. The first-year budget will be sufficient.
