1. The RFP states that the ECIDS system is currently in a minimum viable product (MVP) stage. Can you provide more details on the existing technical architecture, platform, and tools that have been implemented for the MVP?	The heart of ECIDS is a trusted broker architecture, which allows for the sharing of ECE data between internal and external organizations without compromising privacy, security, and interoperability. It enforces access control and privacy throughout the system and abstracts the source systems from data consumers, allowing the system to route the request to the known source without the need for the consumer to directly connect. It only retrieves the authorized data based upon the access privileges of the customer.
	Azure Integration Runtime provides a secure connection to Azure Data Factory and transitions data from the Data Provider component to the Data Broker. ECIDS employs a staging data lake and medallion architecture which moves the data through a series of standardization, deidentification, and matching steps to prepare it for consumption by visualizations. The Bronze layer mirrors the source system and at a given time the layer has the entire dataset; the Silver layer is used for data standardization, de-duplication, cleansing, enhancing addresses (particularly important for visualizations with strong geographic components), record matching, and the removal of identified information; and the Gold layer moves de-identified data into the ECIDS Data Warehouse.
