

In-home Services RFI Questions 6, 13, & 20

The table below illustrates the count of youth being served point-in-time by Child Welfare Providers. For purposes of counting the youth that will be candidates for in-home prevention services per the Family First Prevention Services Act, it's not yet known how many of the out-of-home youth will be able to be served in-home. Service availability among other factors will effect this count. It is difficult to determine candidacy until there is guidance from ACF.
