1	General	N/A	If all vendors of prevention services are required to go through this same RFQ process, which includes requirements for maintaining specific insurance, establishing financial viability, etc., it will likely exclude a sizable number of providers who currently provide EBPs related to prevention. As an example, of the approximately 20 therapists we train each year in Child-Parent Psychotherapy, a majority would not be part of agencies large enough to likely complete the RFQ process as it currently exists. My	Insurance requirements can be negotiated during contract finalization period. See question #15 of Addendum 2 and III.G.4 of the RFQ. Pursuant to State Statute (43-4410), the Department of Health and Human Services must conduct a financial review before entering into a child welfare services contract.
