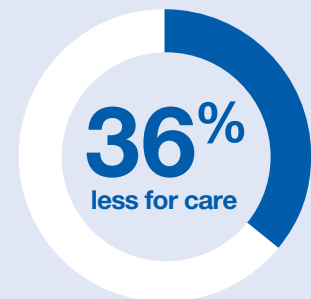
Get personalized estimates.
